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IRS adds more North Carolina counties, Hurricane Florence-related tax relief

The IRS added another seven North Carolina counties—Alamance, Durham, Guilford, Madison, Polk, Rowan, and Tyrrell—to the existing list of counties for purposes of identifying areas where tax relief may be available for certain taxpayers affected by Hurricane Florence. In general, the tax relief includes more time to file returns, pay taxes, and perform certain other time-sensitive acts for taxpayers affected by Hurricane Florence.

According to the IRS release—[NC-2018-01](#) (updated October 26, 2018)—individual or business taxpayers located in the North Carolina counties of Alamance, Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Cabarrus, Carteret, Chatham, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Dare, Davidson, Duplin, Durham, Granville, Greene, Guilford, Harnett, Hoke, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Madison, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Orange, Pamlico, Pender, Person, Pitt, Polk, Randolph, Richmond, Robeson, Rowan, Sampson, Scotland, Stanly, Tyrrell, Union, Wayne, Wilson, and Yancey may qualify for tax relief.

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
