The Slovak Government Approved First of the Measures Aimed at Helping the Economy

Yesterday, the Government approved the Draft Regulation of the Slovak Government on the cancelation of the tax underpayment corresponding to the unpaid penalty related to the paid income tax that in principle extends the deadline for filing of the tax returns.

The Ministry of Economy has also submitted a new draft of measures aimed at helping the economy in connection with the spread of the COVID-19.
